SBTC Disaster Relief to Help Feed Tornado Victims
Feeding Unit from Lufkin to be Stationed in Onalaska

Onalaska, TX — April 28, 2020 — Volunteers with [Southern Baptists of Texas Convention Disaster Relief](#) (SBTC Disaster Relief) will help to prepare more than 1,500 meals per day for tornado victims in Polk County. The deadly twister ripped through that area last week, destroying dozens of homes.

A feeding unit from Unity Baptist Association in Lufkin will be stationed at the Garland Park Pavilion in Onalaska (600 Onalaska Loop) and will be used to feed the community.

“This mobile kitchen has the capacity to prepare more than 5,000 hot meals a day,” said SBTC DR Director Scottie Stice. “We count it a privilege to help this community in its time of need.”

Stice estimates that the volunteers will prepare meals for 5 days. The need will be reevaluated at that time as this is a rapidly changing context.
