WHAT IS YOUTH WEEK?

Youth Week is a camp for students who have **completed** 6th grade through 12th grade. This camp includes Bible studies with students from other churches, recreation and afternoon free time, all facilitated by The Southern Baptists of Texas Convention, the Riverbend Retreat Center staff and invited guests. Evening activities include worship, church group time, and camp-wide fellowships.

REGISTRATION

REGISTRATION DEPOSIT

Online registration opens January 2022. Because space is limited, please register your group online as soon as possible. Once Youth Week is full, registration will be closed.

A deposit of \$25 per person is due upon online registration. This deposit confirms your participation at Youth Week, holds your spaces at camp and locks in the price. Please note the cancellation policy below. This deposit is non-refundable but will be applied toward your balance due or can be transferred to another student's registration. CANCELLATION POLICY

Registered spaces may be dropped until Monday, June 27th with no penalty. After this date, the church/group is responsible for the **FULL** cost of registration, regardless of the number of students actually present. **No refunds will be offered after the cut-off date.**

REGISTRATION

Online registration may be completed at any time and begins with listing your church, contact person, contact information and camper information. Once you set-up your online registration, you can view or make changes by logging back onto the registration site and updating your information until Monday, July 11 if space is available

**All registration for Youth Week Summer Camp is done by church groups.
Individuals wanting to attend must sign up with a church group that is attending camp.**

Your registration is not complete until you go through the final check-in process on Tuesday, July 19th of camp at the designated check-in area. When you go through onsite check-in, one of the Youth Week Camp staff will walk you through the information that you have submitted on the registration site and confirm that the information is correct. The student minister or group leader should be prepared to turn in a registration confirmation received by e-mail. Please have the

following documents with you at check-in: (also listed on appendix on page 10)

- Original and two copies of the registration/medical form for all students and sponsors.
 - One for you, one for SBTC and one for Riverbend, unless you have already e-mailed to SBTC (sshelton@sbtexas.com)
- Liability Release & Indemnity for every person attending camp
- Supervisor Standards from every adult sponsor
- Church documents.
 - Church Indemnity Agreement
 - Adult Sponsor Letter of Church Recommendation, if any modifications were made after registration and initial letter was sent

REGISTRATION COST

Early Bird Registration	\$225 per person – this rate is offered through Monday June 20, 2022
Regular Registration	\$250 per person – this rate will apply to all new registrations made from Tuesday June 21 - Monday July 11, 2022 REGISTRATION CLOSSES AT THE END OF MONDAY, JULY 11th.

*The registration fee includes lodging, meals, camp activities, complete use of the camp facilities, when available, and a Youth Week Summer Camp t-shirt. *The t-shirt size is only guaranteed for those who register by July 4, 2022.*

Students should plan to bring extra spending money for merchandise, soft drinks/bottled water, snacks, souvenirs, etc. but it is not required.

WHAT TO BRING CAMP:

- Bedding – All bunk beds have mattresses only and each camper will need to bring twin sheets and blanket or bedroll and a pillow.
- Personal toiletries including wash cloth, towel, shower shoes, etc.
- Bible, note paper, and pencil or pen
- Flashlight, sunscreen and bug spray – Please make sure your camper knows the how, when and why of their proper application.
- Money for snack shop and gift shop, if desired.
- Nose plugs and water shoes for lake activities are encouraged.
- Summer clothing (see dress code below).
- Medications – Make sure your child/youth's medical forms are complete and medications are in the original container(s) in Ziploc bags marked with child/youth's name.
- If your child/youth has food allergies or other special nutritional needs, please have parents fill out the "Allergy & Special Dietary Needs Form" located at bendfoodallergy.org. They can also follow-up with the Food Service Coordinator at 888.269.4434 x2008

WHAT NOT TO BRING TO CAMP:

- Alcohol, tobacco, illegal drugs, fireworks, water guns, or any kind of weapon
- No cell phones, iPods, PlayStation portables or other gaming devices, roller blades or skateboards. If a camper is seen in use of any of these devices during camp activities, they will be confiscated and returned to the adult leader at the end of the week. Cell phone use is allowed with restrictions for adult leaders (to call campers parents, etc.)

during Free Time and other times when the leader is not directly supervising the campers

- Items that may be used for pranks such as water balloons, shaving cream, silly string, gum, etc. **Pranks are not allowed at camp.** Your church will be charged for any damages or issues related to clean up. There will be serious consequences for those who participate in or attempt to do such activities.

DRESS CODE:

Make sure your student does **NOT** pack anything that:

- Advertises alcohol, tobacco, illegal drugs.
- Explicitly or implicitly promotes racism, sexism, or hatred of any group or person.
- Explicitly or implicitly refers to sexual actions or situations.
- Has spaghetti/small straps or open back, shirts exposing the midriff, tank tops, or muscle shirts.
- Sleeveless cut off shirts with holes that expose sides, or anything that must be worn with something underneath.
- Is excessively short or tight fitting. Cheerleader shorts or any outfits with lettering on the bottoms are not allowed.

While at camp, we ask that student:

- Wear sleeved t-shirts and modest shorts (when hands are extended to the side and the front, fingertips must touch fabric) during the day due to the nature of group building recreation and outdoor activities. Basketball shorts are allowed for both boys and girls.
- Closed toe, closed heel shoes must be worn by participants during recreation.
- Girls must wear modest, one-piece bathing suits covered with a dark colored t-shirt and swimming shorts, if participating in water activities. Guys must have trunk-style shorts and a T-shirt. ***These are to be worn to and from water recreations and while swimming.***
- Wear modest shorts, dresses (no spaghetti/small straps or open back), skirts, pants, and jeans to worship. Long pants are required for students or adults participating in worship on stage.
- Do not dress in a way that calls attention to underwear (sagging your pants, rolling down your waistbands, etc.) or wear pants or shorts with lettering on the bottom.
- Wristbands given to each camper at check-in are required to be always worn during camp.
****Adult leaders have the responsibility of modeling and monitoring their group to ensure students are dressing appropriately. There will be consequences for campers and adult leaders who do not follow the dress code guidelines.***

SPECIAL NEEDS REQUEST

Youth Week Summer Camp takes the special needs of students and adults seriously. Meeting your needs and setting up your group for a great week of camp is important to us. While we understand the spiritual need for your students is great, we would like to specifically know about physical and emotional needs. These needs include but are not limited to wheelchair accessibility, hearing/sight impairment, food allergies, etc. If one of your students has a special need that should be handled before camp starts, please call our office toll-free line (877.953.SBTC) and share this with our events registration team so it can be handled properly. SPONSOR QUALIFICATIONS

ADULT LEADER INFORMATION

Each church bringing students must provide ADULT Leaders. The formula for numbers is based on one (1) Adult Leader for every eight (8) students [i.e.: 1 to 8 students require 1 Adult Leader; 9 to 16 students require 2 Adult Leaders; etc.]. They must also be of the same gender as the students being supervised.

Adult Sponsors are a vital part of Youth Week. They serve as encouragers, discussion leaders, friends, and dorm supervisors to a group of students. During the week, sponsors become a “Mom” or “Dad” to the students and minister to each student. This assignment demands a spiritually mature and growing person. Make sure the people you bring are above reproach, walking with God and of good moral character.

ADULT LEADERS' QUALIFICATIONS & RESPONSIBILITIES

- Be recommended by their Pastor/Youth Pastor.
- Be a spiritually mature/growing person who is at least 21 years of age at the start of camp.
- Be a happy, positive person.
- Have a heart for young people and be willing to invest his/her life in the lives of students.
- Must attend sponsor meetings every morning during camp.
- Sponsors must obey the rules of Youth Week Summer Camp – ***just like the students.***
- Be willing to lead in small group discussions, Bible study, etc.
- Sponsors are responsible for monitoring the dress code and behavior of your students.
- Sponsors should model appropriate dress code and behavior.
- Encourage participation and promptness by setting an example.
- Ensure students are having a daily quiet time, preferably during the assigned times before the Bible Study (quiet time materials are provided at camp).

IMPORTANT NOTICE

The Texas Department of State Health Services and Texas State law requires any adult over 18 years of age who has contact with children at camp to be screened for criminal and sex offender records. In addition, the adults are also required to take a Child Protection training course and pass a test regarding child protection and reducing the risk of child abuse and molestation. This law applies to all state licensed youth camps and is meant for the safety and protection of the children. The test needs to be completed before your arrival at camp. The training and testing are administered thru Ministry Safe. See appendix for more information or call Juani Shelton at 817-552-2500 for more details.

All sponsors and campers 18 years of age are required to complete the background check. All sponsors are required to complete the Child Protection training. These must be completed before the start of camp. No sponsor or camper who needs to go thru this process will be allowed to stay at the camp without completing these requirements.

The following documents need to be sent immediately after the online registration has been completed for adult sponsors over the age of 21 attending camp. We will send a link for the background to be completed by the sponsors and campers who are 18 years old.

- a. Please include the e-mail addresses for each person. SBTC team will contact each individual person to complete the background check and child protection certificate training thru Ministry Safe.

A FEW SIMPLE RULES

- All students/adult leaders must attend the entire week of camp and must participate in all scheduled activities, if physically able. Students and/or sponsors will not be allowed to remain in their cabins while activities are being held.
- Sponsors, you must always remain with your kids. This is State Law. During the day, be keenly aware of where they are during different activities and in the evening, they need to be with you. Students need to stay IN THEIR DORMS after camp activities have ended for the day and lights out is in effect.
- Adults, avoid situations where you're alone & hidden with one camper, regardless of their gender.
- Many injuries occur when campers roughhouse on bunks or in rooms; please do not let this happen.
- It is NEVER acceptable to be in a sleeping area or bathroom of the opposite gender.
- Absolutely no drugs, tobacco, or alcohol of any kind will be allowed. Any student found possessing such items will be sent home immediately at parents' expense.
- Every church must have an ON-CAMPUS Adult Contact Person in case of a student emergency from their church. This can be Youth/Student Minister, Pastor, Adult Leader, etc. and must be always at camp.
- Youth Week does not have space or childcare provisions to accommodate children of sponsors who are under the age of 12 and/or not registered campers. Exceptions will only be made for guest speakers and artists whose families travel with them on the road and have a designated "nanny."

CHURCH/GROUP DEVOTIONS

Church Group Devotion is a time for each church group to be together in the evenings to debrief the day. This time usually lasts for 30 mins. The group leader needs to determine what should be discussed, taught, or followed up after the evening session's time with the Word of God. There will be invitations at the end of each message every night.

TEAM ASSIGNMENTS

Students attending Youth Week will be assigned to teams based upon the grade they just completed in the spring of 2022. Advise students to bring clothing that matches your color to show team spirit.

- **GOLD TEAM:** Students who completed 6th grade
- **PURPLE TEAM:** Students who completed 7th grade

- **RED TEAM:** Students who completed 8th grade
- **BLUE TEAM:** Students who completed 9th grade
- **ORANGE TEAM:** Students who completed 10th grade
- **YELLOW TEAM:** Students who completed 11th grade
- **GREEN TEAM:** Students who completed 12th grade

ARRIVAL AT CAMP

When you arrive to camp this summer, please designate **one** leader from each church to provide essential documents at the check-in desk: (see APPENDIX, page 10). Once registration is complete, you can move into your assigned cabin.

Check-in will take place between 3 pm and 5 pm. Look for banners to point you to the Youth Week Check-in. You should not have to bring payment with you, unless you have changes at the last minute, as payments are due prior to arrival at camp. We will be receiving those payments if you need to make them. T-shirts and other camp materials will be issued to you during registration. T-shirt sizes and group color is not guaranteed for those who register after July 4, 2022.

VEHICLES & PARKING

There will be a designated area for church vehicles to park. Limit your car, van, or truck traffic to basic equipment-moving needs during arrival and departure from camp. It is absolutely prohibited to move your vehicle during the camp week or leave the encampment except in case of emergency.

LODGING

Youth Week staff will assign lodging by church group and gender (guys and male shepherds from same church in a cabin, etc.) Lodging assignments will be given out at on-site check-in. For smaller churches, we will group multiple churches and leaders in a cabin together to best utilize the space available. Because we will use all rooms for staff, speakers, artists and church groups, there are no separate hotel rooms available for youth ministers or pastors. There are cleaning items available in the cabins; each group is responsible for the up keeping of their assigned cabin and to leave it as clean as possible at the end of the week. Make sure each camper contributes to this task during the week, assign and rotate different areas to each member of your group and coordinate your responsibilities if you share a cabin with another group.

MEDICATIONS

ALL MEDICATIONS MUST BE GIVEN TO & DISPENSED BY THE DESIGNATED CAMP NURSE FOR KIDS AND ADULTS. According to Texas Law, all medications, prescription and non-prescription, must be held & dispensed by camp nurse or physician **ONLY**. The camp nurse or physician will be always available to address any medical needs. All medications must be sent in a Ziploc bag with camper, sponsor and church name clearly marked. All medication must also be in its original container. The only exceptions are asthma inhalers or other emergency meds that need to be always carried. All medications must be reported and listed under MEDICATIONS on the Health Card & Registration Form.

DAMAGES | LOST ITEMS

- Please be aware that your group is personally responsible for damages to any facilities including but not limited to the dorm room your group occupies.
- Please turn in all items that seem to be lost to the registration/check-in room. All items left behind in cabins will become property of the encampment.

EVALUATIONS

Every person who attends camp will receive an evaluation form to provide feedback on every aspect of camp. Please take time to fill it out and help us better serve you and improve your camp experience.

REGISTRATION PACKETS

The forms in this registration packet are **mandatory** for each person (adult or student) attending Youth Week. Each church/group will be responsible for submitting the required forms as stated on the check list on page 10. **Please note the checklist on page 10 when preparing for on-site check-in.**

- *All medications must be given to the Camp Health Officer. Place them in a large Ziploc bag with your child's name and church name. Prescriptions must be in the original container with the camper's name and the current dosage. No medications will be given unless they are in original containers per Texas Department of State Health Services. If your child/youth requires an asthma inhaler or antidote for insect bite or allergies (prescribed by doctor) have them bring at least two (2) to camp. The medication must be registered with Camp Health Officer. One (1) will be kept and closely guarded by camper and one (1) given to the Camp Health Officer. Similar special cases must be discussed with Camp Health Officer. If the need arises, I give my permission for my child/youth to be inspected for head lice/eggs. I understand any such check would be conducted sensitively. I understand Riverbend's Notice of Privacy Practices uses and disclose health information about my child/youth to the Summer Camp Director, Executive Director, his designee, the child's sponsor and medical staff, when in its sole discretion, believes such communication to be in the best interest of my child for treatment, to obtain payment for treatment, administrative purposes and to evaluate the quality of care that he/she receives. I agree to the release of any records necessary for treatment, referral, billing or insurance purposes.

SUPERVISION STANDARDS

Supervision Standards

The following are the basic supervision policies that will be observed. Each adult worker/volunteer must sign to confirm their intent to comply with the Supervision Standards listed below.

- No unmonitored one-on-one situations – at no time, shall any child be alone with only one worker/volunteer. Exceptions might be for counseling in a location where both the worker/volunteer and child can be observed at all times.
- No inappropriate touching of minors (for discipline or otherwise) and limited physical contact. Physical discipline is prohibited.
- Respect of privacy – respect the privacy of minors in situations like changing clothes, showers, restrooms, etc. Adults must protect their own privacy also in these situations. Using cameras of any kind are prohibited in these private environments.
- Monitoring – all activities must take place in rooms that can be observed. In addition, at times parents may also view children’s activities if they do so discreetly and do not disrupt the event in progress.
- Ratios – the appropriate numbers of adults will supervise minors of various age groups based on accepted standards.
- Peer-to-peer abuse – peer-to-peer abuse will not be tolerated.
- No forced participation – all recreational or physical activities are optional.
- If a participant’s behavior becomes detrimental to themselves or others, a report should be made to the SBTC staff member in charge of the event.
- All workers/volunteers will strive to be a Godly witness to minors, other workers, and parents.

In the interest of the safety for minor participants, I agree to make best efforts to comply with these supervision standards.

Intentional shepherding of students should be at the heart of what you do. We encourage sponsors to model a transformed life and mentor students in their young faith.

1. Check-in is on Tuesday from 3:00 PM until 5:00 PM. Simply show up, check-in, pick up your group's materials and move on. Please remember that there will be no refunds...no exceptions.

2. There should be 1 adult sponsor for every 8 students. Church groups must attend with the appropriate number of adult sponsors. Adult sponsors MUST BE 21 YEARS OF AGE or older and must always model a Christ-like attitude in their behavior and dress.

4. There will be an invitation at the conclusion of each message and adult sponsors will be asked and encouraged to counsel with the students' making decisions.

5. Please sit with your students at all possible times: rallies, worship services, mealtimes, What's Next, etc. Please make it a priority, especially during worship time, to help minimize distractions and be sensitive to how your teens are responding to the messages. You will need to stay for the duration of each session. Groups getting up to leave are a HUGE distraction! If you cannot be with your group for some reason, please make sure you know where your students are and who they are with.

6. Make sure you plan plenty of time to debrief in the appropriate group/church time about what's been learned, celebrate the decisions made and establish accountability/prayer partners in your group before returning home.

7. Please have all camp behavioral guidelines and expectations communicated to all attending BEFORE you arrive at the event.

8. Make sure that your students conduct themselves in a polite and cordial manner. When teens are up and running around past curfew and being too loud, this reflects negatively on you, the students, your church and the SBTC. Please remind your students that they are representing both their church and their Lord.

FAILURE TO OBEY THESE RULES MAY RESULT IN AN INDIVIDUAL OR GROUP BEING ASKED TO LEAVE THE CAMPGROUNDS IMMEDIATELY!

PARENTS, YOUR SUPPORT IS CRITICAL TO THE SUCCESS OF THIS CAMP'S SPIRITUAL GOALS. PLEASE REVIEW THESE GUIDELINES WITH YOUR STUDENT(S).

1. Youth Week is an SBTC Christian camp. All rules are to help us in our conduct, which will reflect Christ in all we do. All campers must know and follow these rules.
2. Remember, WRISTBANDS ARE REQUIRED TO BE WORN AT ALL TIMES DURING CAMP.
3. Please respect all camp property just as you would the church you attend. All facilities must be left clean and in order. Also, we ask you to assist in keeping the grounds clean of trash.
4. The following items are not permitted on the grounds; illegal drugs, alcohol, knives, ANY form of tobacco, guns, fireworks, skateboards, personal music playing devices (CD players, MP3 players, iPods, etc.), water balloons, cursing, fighting, or anything deemed detrimental to the intended atmosphere of the camp.
5. Campers are not to bring or carry cell phones on the campgrounds. Sponsors may carry their own personal cell phones. Parents may contact their children via the sponsors or the camp office. Camper cell phones will be confiscated and returned to the sponsors at the end of the week.
6. Appropriate, modest dress is required for attendees. All tops/shirts must have sleeves, no sleeveless shirts. Inappropriate clothing includes and is not limited to short shorts, cheerleader shorts, tight shorts, short skirts, strapless tops, spaghetti straps, shirts exposing the midriff, tank tops, muscle shirts and, for guys, not wearing a shirt.
7. Students must attend all scheduled sessions and activities during the week unless they are ill or are accompanied by a sponsor. At no time should students be outside of the venue of the scheduled event. **Students are not allowed to stay in their cabins by themselves at any time.**
8. Pranks, jokes, etc., of a dangerous nature are not permitted. (Ex. Shaving cream fights will NOT be tolerated.)
9. Students may not drive or ride in a car during the week of camp. No ATV's, scooters or motorized vehicles of any kind are permitted.

10. Furnishings and/or equipment may not be altered or removed from any building without permission from the Administrator. Use of conference rooms, activities building, etc., must be scheduled through the Administrator. Payment for any damage to camp property will be made by the group, church, or individuals responsible.
11. Use of swimming areas shall be under the supervision of an adult sponsor who will be expected to enforce standard safety regulations. Swimming is allowed only during designated times. No one may swim alone; there must be always at least 2 people.
12. All swimwear must be modest and reflective of Christian character and worn only during swimming. Girls must wear a one-piece bathing suit with a dark-colored T-shirt and swimming shorts. Guys must have trunk-style shorts and a T-shirt. The lifeguard must be always obeyed.
13. No one is allowed to enter or be near the dorms of campers of the opposite sex at any time.
14. All t-shirts, caps, etc., which advertise alcohol, tobacco products or are of a suggestive nature may not be worn. Displaying gang colors, indecent speech and/or conduct will not be tolerated.
15. No student may share ANY medication with another student. **All** medication, prescription and nonprescription must be in original packaging and must be checked in with the camp nurse upon arrival.

144 south 2- Flashing red light at the Square turn left, still
Hwy 144 (go ½mile)
- 3- Left at FM 56 “Riverbend Retreat Center” sign, (go 2.5 miles) *****NOTE**
- 4- Left at County Road 411 “Riverbend Retreat Center” sign, (go 1.8 miles)
- 5- Left at County Road 411B “Riverbend Retreat Center” sign-entry road to Riverbend

*****NOTE**

If there have been heavy rains you will need to:

- Continue on FM 56, ½ mile to junction with FM 202, turn left and continue on FM 56 1.2 miles
- Turn left on County Road 411
- Continue on County Road 411 for 2 miles to 411B “Riverbend Retreat Center” sign-entry road to Riverbend, turn right.
