# **Texas Legislative Alert – April 28, 2023**

## **Protecting Women and Children:**

### 1. Save Women's Sports Act Hearing

SB 15, by Senator Mayes Middleton, would protect female athletes in college from having to compete against biological males in women's sports competitions. To date, 15 other states have passed laws to protect women's collegiate sports and it is time for Texas to act on behalf of women. Allowing biological men who claim to be trans women to take away athletic scholarships and opportunities from our sisters and daughters is wrong and must be prohibited.

We need to restore the original purpose of Title IX, and the God-created distinctions of male and female. SB 15 was passed in the Senate, but now needs passage in the House.

# 2. Protect children under the age of 18 by banning surgical procedures or pharmaceuticals that are for the purpose of gender transitioning or gender reassignment.

SB 14, by Senator Donna Campbell and HB 1686 by Rep. Tom Oliverson, have authored bills to prohibit procedures and treatments for gender transitioning, gender reassignment, or gender dysphoria and the use of public money or public assistance to provide those procedures and treatments to minors.

SB 14 was passed out of the Senate and should be voted on by the House sometime next week. We need to show up in the House gallery to show support that Texas MUST protect our children from the horrors of what these procedures are doing and prevent a lifetime of regret. Now is the time, approximately 14 other states have already passed these protections.

# 3. Prohibit all sexually oriented performances on public grounds in front of minors adding both criminal and civil penalties.

SB 12 by Senator Hughes strongly defines "drag performance" and this bill is needed now as various establishments, even "educational" institutions are hosting sexually explicit drag performances in front of children. SB 12 has passed the Senate and is now in the House State Affairs Committee, which has not scheduled it for a hearing yet.

**ACTION:** Please contact the House State Affairs Chair, Rep. Todd Hunter at <a href="mailto:todd.hunter@house.texas.gov">todd.hunter@house.texas.gov</a>, or call 512-463-0672 and communicate that a hearing is needed immediately on SB 12 and passage is critical. Time is of the essence.

4. Prohibit sexual orientation and gender related conversations and instructions in public schools expanding the responsibilities of the Student Health Advisory Council to include policy recommendations of when and how human sexuality can be discussed outside of health class.

SB 1072 by Senator Hughes would accomplish this. It was heard in Senate Public Education and is set to be brought to the Senate floor for a vote.

**ACTION:** Please call Lt. Governor Dan Patrick at 512-463-0001 and ask him to bring SB 1072 to the floor for a vote to be sent over to the House.

# **Religious Liberty:**

#### 1. Religious Liberty for Attorneys

H.B. 2846 By Rep. Briscoe Cain seeks to address, preemptively, the growing attack on freedom of speech and expression of religious beliefs by prohibiting the state bar from adopting a rule that could limit a person's ability to obtain, maintain, or renew a law license based on the person's religious belief or burden a license applicant's or state bar member's free exercise of religion, freedom of speech about their faith, membership in any religious organization, or freedom of association.

HB 2846 has been sent to the House Calendars and needs to get to the House floor for a vote. The senate companion version by Senator Hughes, SB 559, has already been passed by the Senate so we need urgent action in the House.

**ACTION:** There are two different ways you can help.

- 1. Please call or email the Chair of the Calendars committee, Rep. Dustin Burrow, and tell him they need to pass HB 2846 and get it to the House floor for a vote to protect the religious liberties of attorneys. You can email Rep. #### 1. Sports Betting

HJR 102 and HB 1942 by Rep. Jeff Leach would legalize Sports Betting in Texas, which is known to be highly addictive, especially for our young people. A vote on these bills could come at any time on the House floor.
